## **Data Collection for Indicators**

Dog leash non-compliance – visitors allowing dogs to roam off leash

Data collection:

- Observation-based examining dog and owner location, behavior and characteristics
- Multiple data collection platforms (free/low cost)
  - Web-based using Google Sites and Drive (Form, Spreadsheet)
  - iPhone App: Forms
  - Paper version of Google Form
- Visitor-horse interaction visitors approaching and interacting with the horses on Rachel Carson Island

Data collection:

- Behavior observations similar to dog-leash indicator
- 2 locations near the water hole
- Laser rangefinder used to evaluate distance measure between the visitor and the horse
- Camera monitoring provides additional data

#### 3. Informal trail/site proliferation –

creation of informal trails in the area by visitors

Data collection:

Photo-point monitoring method

- 3 select locations
- Permanent photo-points established
- Photos taken facing 4 cardinal directions at fixed height
- Extent and pattern of disturbed areas quantified from photos using a grid and percent vegetation cover class
- Monitoring repeated every 3-6 months
