

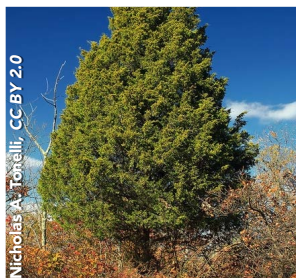
# LANDSCAPING FOR THE COAST

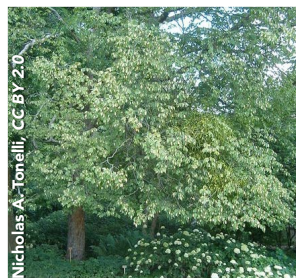

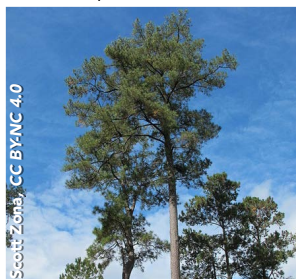

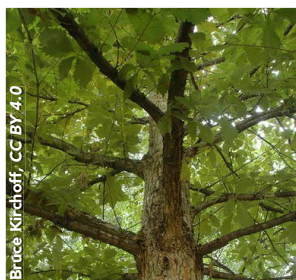

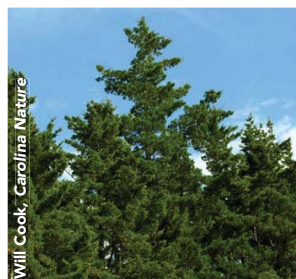

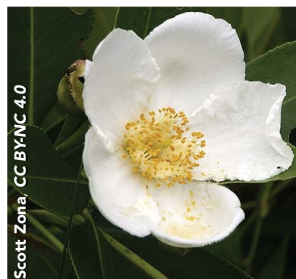

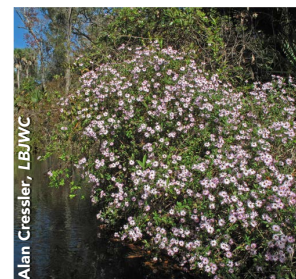
